ENGLISH

Do any two out of the three given tasks.

1. Activity Title: Story Puppet Parade

- Choose a Short Story
- Pick a very simple and fun story – fairy tale, folk tale, or story from the textbook.
- Make 3–4 Stick Puppets
 - Use ice cream sticks or straws.
 - Draw and cut out characters and important objects from the story.
 - Paste them on the sticks to create puppets.
- Tell the Story Using Puppets
- Write 3–4 simple sentences to retell the story in order. You can either:
 - Paste the sentences on a card and read while using puppets
 - Or just speak the story aloud in class like a puppet show

2. My Dream Trip – Passport to Imagination

- Imagine you're going on a trip to the moon, a jungle, or under the sea!
- Make a pretend passport (on paper) with your photo and travel stamps.
- Write a postcard from that place describing what you saw and felt.

3. Interview My Toy!

- Pick your favourite toy.
- Write 5 fun questions you would ask it.
- Now write the toy's answers in its voice!
- Add a photo/drawing of the toy.

Create a Constellation

Instructions -

1. Use a black colour A 4 size sheet.
2. Draw any constellation using a silver or white pen over it.
3. Paste star sequins of silver colour on the sheet representing the stars present in that constellation.
4. paste the sheet in your SST notebook.

COMPUTER

Make a computer collage using newspaper or magazine cut outs. Write 5 sentences about how you use a computer at home or school.

ART

You're required to create 2 to 4 small sculptures (about 4-5 inches tall) using silver foil (like aluminum foil). They should show different action poses — for example, jumping, dancing, running, etc. You can copy the style shown in the **sample picture** you have, or come up with your own creative poses.

Here's a simple step-by-step if you want help getting started:

1. Take a sheet of silver foil — about the size of an A4 paper.
2. Crumple and shape it gently to make a body — first the torso, then pull out arms and legs.
3. Pose it — bend the arms and legs to show movement (like a dancer raising one arm or a runner leaning forward).
4. Smooth or add more foil if needed to make the sculpture stronger.
5. Make at least 2 and maximum 4 figures, each in a different action mode and compose them on a hard base. It can be cardboard or a small piece of ply.

Enjoy the activity and have fun exploring different movements of life.

Submit your completed work in your class within one week after the summer break.
